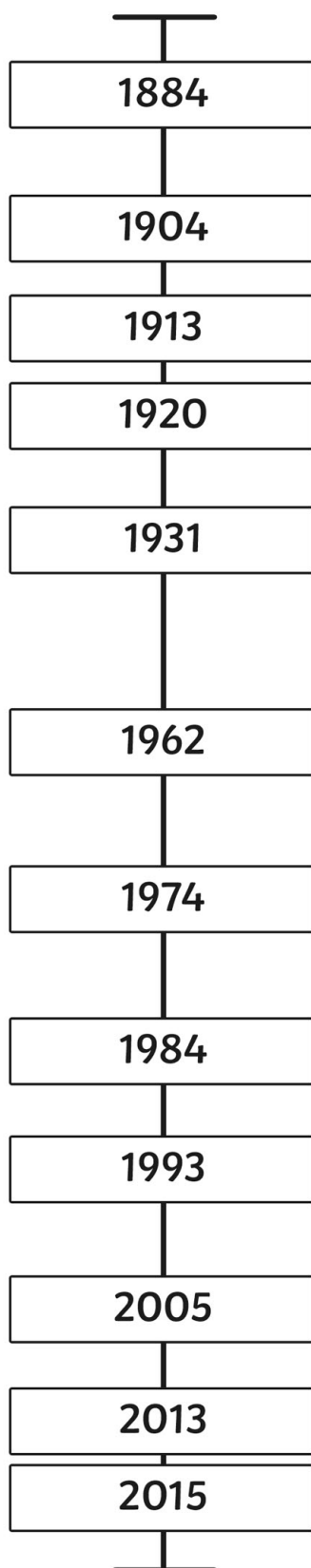


History of the Gaelic Athletic Association

- The GAA purchase Jones' Road Grounds and rename in Croke Memorial Park.
- The name Cumann Lúthchleas Gael is introduced by the GAA.
- 13 people are killed in Croke Park during an attack by Auxiliary Forces. This day is known as Bloody Sunday.
- A plan to develop Croke Park is put into place.
- A meeting is held in Hayes Hotel, Tipperary. This is the beginning of the Gaelic Athletic Association.
- The GAA allow soccer and rugby matches to take place in Croke Park for the first time, only on a temporary basis while the AVIVA Stadium is being built.
- The first official camogie matches are played.
- The Ladies Gaelic Football Association is established in Thurles, Co Tipperary.
- The first GAA match was broadcast live on Téilifís Éireann.
- Dublin win the All-Ireland.
- The GAA celebrates its 100th anniversary.
- Hawk-Eye is used for the first time.
